

Learning Time

Fall Walk

- 1. Discuss signs of Fall.
- Everyone can take a walk and look for colorful leaves, pinecones, pine needles, cocoons, and other signs of autumn.
- 3. Collect in paper bags any "treasures" twigs, stones, fallen leaves found along the way.



Fall Poem

You will need: red, yellow, and brown leaves

- 1. Hold up appropriate color leaves while everyone says this fall poem. One, two, three pretty leaves I see.
 - One is red, one is yellow.
 - One is brown-a funny fellow.
 - One, two, three pretty leaves I see.

Each child can pretend to be a leaf blowing in the wind and floating slowly to the ground.

Snack Ideas

- Serve cut up apples with yogurt dip.
- Serve granola and carob chips with milk.

Snack / Learning Time

Yummy No-Bake Cookies

- 2 cups sugar
- 5 tbsp. cocoa
- ½ cup milk
- 2½ cup quick oats
- ½ lb. butter
- 1 tsp vanilla
- 1. Let children mix first 4 ingredients.
- 2. Boil mixture for 1-½ minutes.
- 3. Remove from heat and add vanilla and oats.
- 4. Beat until stiff.
- 5. Let children drop mixture by spoonful onto waxed paper.
- 6. Let cookies cool.

Story time

Opposite Game

- 1. Say a word and have child say a word that means the opposite . For example: stop-go under-over, up-down, in-out, happy-sad, hot -cold, no-yes, sick-well.
- Tell a story about a little boy who always did the opposite of what he was told. For example: "If his mother told him to wash his face, he would get it dirty. If his father told him to speak quietly, he would speak loudly."

Fall Collages

You will need:
paper plates
treasures from fall walk
glue
marking pen



- 1. Help children print the word "fall" onto plates.
- 2. Children can glue fall treasures on paper plates.



You will need:

Construction paper in fall colors Marking pens Glue

Have each child:

- 1. Draw a tree trunk and branches on a piece of construction paper;
- 2. Tear small leaf shapes from various colors of paper;
- 3. Glue leaves on tree;
- 4. Glue some leaves at bottom of paper to show that autumn leaves are falling off tree.



Yourneed:

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Lightweight paper
Paper clips


Fall leaves

Help each child:

- 1. Place leaves between 2 sheets of paper;
- 2. Clip the sheets together;
- Rub crayon over entire surface and see leaf impressions appear "like magic".

- Let the group help make playhouses by covering tables with sheets. Encourage imaginative play.

Outdoor Play

Painting with Grass

long grass water in bucket



- 1. Dip long grass into bucket of water.
- 2. Use grass like a brush and paint on cement.

Jumping through Leaves

- 1. Take turns raking leaves outside;
- 2. Huddle down in pile of leaves;
- 3. Count to 3 out loud and then jump up;
- 4. Walk and run in leaves to make crackling sound.

Balloon Kite

Inflated balloons Marking pens Strings

- 1. Have children gently draw faces or designs on balloons.
- 2. Help children attach strings to balloons.
- 3. Have them run with balloons, letting balloons "fly."
